- **What is E2 Educational Experience?** E2 has developed a unique concept in homeschool education providing a workbook that utilizes assignments, coupled with hands-on clinical experiences in medical science. There are 8 different modules of information and basic health care skills. E2 also has workshops and camps designed for students interested in the medical sciences. Another outstanding feature is our affiliation with HOSA, the student organization for students interested in health care science. HOSA provides leadership, competition, and volunteer opportunities for our students.
- **How long will it take the homeschool student to do the workbook?** The workbook provides a yearlong introductory class on medical science. There also will be a topic entered on our website each week of the school year which can be used for discussion at home or in our blog.
- **What is the price of the book? Any additional fees?** The price of the student workbook is \$99.95. This workbook contains basic information for the student who is interested in health care or medicine. Our website has videos on how to complete the skills. In the workbook, there are check off sheets for each skill. Our trained staff is available for tutoring once a week for a small fee of \$30 an hour. The students will need additional supplies to complete this class. You can purchase the required items on your own. We are offering the basic kit for \$50 and a more advanced kit for \$70. More information concerning these kits is on our website. - **How is my child assessed?** Parents can access their children with the grade sheets and a comprehensive grade report when the student completes the workbook.
